## **Bexar County Infrastructure Services, Flood Control Division**

### **FY 2008 Flood Control Capital Improvement Program, Phase 1, Year 1-2 Professional Engineering Services RFQ**

*All questions were due no later than 4:00 p.m. on Thursday January 10, 2008.*

#### **QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:**

Q: On the Hausman Road drainage project, is the county looking to construct the ultimate 4-lane secondary arterial or re-construct it to the existing two lane configuration?

A: Hausman is on the major thoroughfare plan and is considered as a Secondary Arterial with an ultimate width of 86-feet, a traffic study may be considered to determine if the full ultimate pavement section is required now.

Q: Is there a need for a landscape architect on the county projects?

A: County is not necessarily stating a need for a Landscape Architect. Each project should be assessed by the engineer as to what the engineer thinks is required for that particular project.

Q: Does a Public Involvement task need to be identified in the SOQ?

A: You do not have to have a Public Involvement task identified in your SOQ. The Program will handle this matter.

Q: From reading the RFQ it is our understanding that no Minority Goals have been set for any of these projects. Is that correct?

A: The County does not have established goals for Minority participation. County does encourage the use of small business/minority firms but it is not required.

Q: Do projects SA2 and LC17 include preparing CLOMR's and submitting to FEMA, since the floodplain will be changed on both projects?

A: If the flood plain limits of a project changes due to the proposed improvements, then a CLOMR and LOMR will be done. The Program will submit these documents however; the Engineer of Record will assist in the preparation of the application/submittal as the Engineer of Record will have prepared the H&H study.
