Question:

1. Why is Briggs road mentioned in the Schaefer road project?

Answer:

The label of Briggs on the Schaefer road project should be replaced by the word Schaefer. The error occurred because the Briggs and Schaefer road projects are similar in nature. Both roadways flood during medium to heavy rainfalls, there is limited existing rights of way (ROW). Therefore the same project solution and description is used for both. A channel to parallel the existing roadway is proposed.

Question:

2. Was a level I or II estimate done for Briggs road?

Answer:

No level I or II was done for Briggs road. The estimate of probable cost for Briggs road was developed by County staff.

Question:

3. What roadway design is anticipated for Shepard road?

Answer:

Shepard road will maintain the existing roadway section.

Question:

4. Why are construction costs on RFQ different for projects as compared to costs as developed in quad sheets (level II)?

Answer:

Project costs stated on the RFQ are based on 1) yearly allocations and 2) without a factor of inflation. Quad sheet (level II) costs are costs over the life of the project and have an added inflation factor of 6% for 5 years.

Question:

5. What level of effort is needed for the LOMR/CLOMR on the Shepard road project?

Answer:

The level of effort shall be that LOMR/CLOMR standard submittals format required by FEMA.

6. What H&H studies are available for the Shepard road project?

Answer:

All available H&H studies are available on www.bexarfloodfacts.org

Question:

7. Should RFQ include a real estate component (sub-consultant)?

Answer:

There is not a need to include a real estate component (sub-consultant) for land acquisition in the RFQ.

8. What minority goals are required by Bexar County as part of the RFQ?

Answer:

At this time Bexar County does not have any small, women, minority, business enterprise (SWMBE) goals. Bexar County encourages the use of small and minority business.

Questions:

9. Please clarify section 3.3.7 in the RFQ?

Answer:

Assessment of workload refers to the workload identified at the office of the prime consultant. Reference to workload is also indirectly identified in section 3.6 of the RFQ. In this section the prime consultant and sub-consultant shall also identify the percentage (%) commitment by each individual listed in the RFQ.

Questions:

10. Please clarify insurance requirement for the RFQ?

Answer:

The RFQ submittal does not require proof of insurance.
