Investigators make arrest in pipe bomb case

An arrest was made early Tuesday morning in the explosives investigation centering around a residence on Timber Country in Northwest Bexar County. Investigators with the Bexar County Fire Marshals Office in partnership with U.S. Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives agents and Deputy U.S. Marshals with the Lone Star Fugitive Task Force served a federal arrest warrant on Tami Lynn Hernandez shortly after midnight.

“This has been an ongoing case that our arson investigators have been working on with the ATF for several weeks, so we’re happy to have made an arrest in the case,” said Bexar County Fire Marshal Ross Coleman. “The arrest can be attributed to the professional and diligent police work completed by the arson investigators and ATF agents, and a strong working relationship with the U.S. Marshals Lone Star Fugitive Task Force.”

Hernandez, 36, was charged with one count of possession of an unregistered destructive device after seeing a federal magistrate Tuesday. Fire Marshal’s investigators will continue to work closely with ATF agents to complete the investigation.
