Collaborations

As the economic engine of Central and South Texas, Bexar County is involved in a number of initiatives to promote the economic growth of our region.

The Northeast Partnership for Economic Development is comprised of representatives from 10 cities in Bexar, Comal and Guadalupe Counties to promote one of the fastest growing areas in our region. Situated along Interstate Highway 35 at the edge of San Antonio, this area is the gateway to New Braunfels, San Marcos and Austin. Major recent developments include:

Anchored by the cities of Austin and San Antonio, the Greater Austin- San Antonio Corridor is made complete by the lifestyle of its thriving communities in between. Today, this trade route plays an increasingly important role in post-NAFTA Texas. The Greater Austin- San Antonio Corridor Council is promoting regional connections through a number of initiatives, including the creation of a commuter rail line to link the cities along the corridor.

The Alamo Area Council of Governments (AACOG) is a voluntary association of cities, counties, and special governmental districts serving 12 counties and 11,354 square miles. AACOG plans for the unified, far-reaching development of the region, eliminates duplication of services, and promotes economy and efficiency through coordination.
