Representatives for either the County or Union may suspend the meeting at any time during the proceedings for consultation with their attorney. Pursuant to Section 551.071 of the Texas Government Code, the deliberations during this period are closed to the public.

The use of cellular phones or sound activated pagers is prohibited while deliberations are being conducted. Please step outside the meeting room should you elect to utilize these devices.

To protect the health of the public and limit the potential spread of COVID 19, the County and the Union will hold this meeting via videoconference. These meeting standards are based upon the various suspended provisions of the Open Meetings Act issued by the Texas Governor in response to the COVID 19 crisis. These modified standards shall remain in place until further notice or until the state disaster declaration expires or is otherwise terminated by the Texas Governor.
