Bexar County Precinct 3 Commissioner Kevin Wolff presented with Transportation Award

Wolff is the recipient of this year's SAMCO award for "Transportation Advocate of the Year."

This morning, Bexar County Precinct 3 Commissioner Kevin Wolff was presented with the 2019 Transportation Advocate of the Year Award from the San Antonio Mobility Coalition (SAMCO).

Throughout his career, Wolff has also helped secure City of San Antonio bond programs for transportation projects, a \$10 additional registration fee for Bexar County, and approval of a plan to streamline the Alamo RMA with staffing from Bexar County.

"This is a distinct honor. As a statesman – not a politician, it has always been my goal to help improve the transportation needs of our community and help to alleviate congestion along our major corridors," stated Commissioner Kevin Wolff. "I know there is a great deal of work left to be done, but in helping to lay down the foundation for future projects and securing funding for those projects, I'm reassured to know that the Bexar County of the future is in good shape."

Over the past decade and beyond, he has been at the forefront of just about every significant transportation infrastructure initiative for our community and region – all while keeping Bexar County toll-free.

Through his leadership, the MPO Policy Board was expanded to include representation from Comal, Guadalupe, and Kendall Counties - and has since served as a model for regional cooperation and coordination.

During his tenure as MPO Chair, funding over \$2.5 billion in new highway projects for our region was secured from the Texas Transportation Commission, including key portions of US 281 N, Loop 1604 N, IH 35 N, and many others.

Kevin Wolff began his career of public service in 2005, as City Councilman for District 5 for the City of San Antonio and led the charge there for increased funding for infrastructure. Subsequently, in his roles as County Commissioner and Chair of the Alamo Metropolitan Planning Organization, he was recognized today for his leadership and efforts to plan secure funding and plan for new projects.
