Bexar County, in conjunction with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT), is the lead agency proposing to widen Watson Road from a two-lane to a four-lane roadway from FM 2790-Somerset Road to .62 mile east along Watson Road in southwest Bexar County, Texas. The total distance for the project is approximately .62 miles. Pursuant to Texas Administrative Code, Title 43, §2.106 this notice is affording an opportunity for a public hearing on the proposed project. The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable Federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried-out by TxDOT pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated December 16, 2014, and executed by FHWA and TxDOT.

The existing facility is a rural type design with no curbs, gutters or storm drain system. Storm water is carried through grass-lined roadside swales. There are currently two 12-foot wide travel lanes with no shoulders in an existing 60-foot right-of-way (ROW) width. There are no existing pedestrian accommodations in this section of Watson Road.

The proposed project will increase capacity, improve mobility, and enhance safety in the area by expanding Watson Road from a two-lane rural facility to a four-lane urban facility that includes operational and drainage improvements. The proposed improvements include curb and gutter, a 10-foot wide hike and bike shared use path on the westbound side of the road and a roundabout at the intersection of Watson Road and Verano Parkway. Approximately 40 feet of new ROW would be required, expanding the ROW width within project limits from 60 to 100 feet. The proposed project would displace two residences. Information about the relocation assistance program, benefits and services for displacees, as well as information about the tentative schedules for ROW acquisition and construction can be obtained from the Bexar County office at the address listed below. Relocation assistance is available for displaced persons and businesses. Construction is expected to begin in 2020.

Any environmental documentation or studies, maps showing the project location and design, tentative construction schedules, and other project information are available for inspection Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. at the Bexar County office located at 233 N. Pecos La Trinidad, Suite 420, San Antonio, Texas 78283. Additionally, responses to comments received will similarly be on file and available for inspection once they have been prepared.

Any interested person may submit comments or request a public hearing covering the social, economic and environmental effects of the proposed location and design for this project. El Condado de Bexar, en par con el Departamento de Transporte de Texas (TxDOT), es la agencia principal de la propuesta para ampliar el camino Watson de un camino de dos aceras a cuatro aceras de FM 2790-Somerset Road a .62 millas al este sobre Watson Road en el Condado Sureste de Bexar, Texas. La distancia total para el Proyecto es de aproximadamente .62 miles. Siguiendo el Código Administrativo de Texas, Titulo 43, §2.106 este aviso está dando la oportunidad para una audiencia pública sobre el Proyecto propuesto. El repaso Ambiental, consulta, y otras acciones requeridas por las leyes ambientales Federales para este Proyecto son, o han sido, llevadas a cabo por TxDOT siguiendo 23 U.S.C. 327 y un Memorándum de Entendimiento fechado 16 de diciembre de 2014, y ejecutado por FHWA y TxDOT.

El existente medio de transporte es un diseño tipo rural sin bordos, alcantarillas, o sistema de drenaje para descargar la tormenta. El agua de Tormenta es llevada a través de una línea de zacate en terreno bajo. Actualmente hay dos aceras para viajar de 12 pies de ancho sin laterales en un camino existente de un ancho de 60-pies para derecho de camino (ROW). No existen acomodaciones para el peatón en esta sección de Watson Road.

El Proyecto propuesto aumentará la capacidad, mejorará la movilidad, e intensificará la seguridad en el área al expandir Watson Road de dos aceras a cuatro aceras urbanas, que incluye mejoramiento en el uso y mejoramiento de drenaje. Los mejoramientos propuestos incluyen bordos y alcantarillas, un camino compartido de 10-pies de ancho para caminar y para bicicletas en el lado camino-oeste de la calle y una rotonda en la intersección de Watson Road y Verano Parkway. Aproximadamente 40 pies de nuevo ROW sería requerido, expandiendo el ancho del ROW dentro de los limites proyectados de 60 a 100 pies. El proyecto propuesto desplazaría dos residencias. Información sobre el programa de asistencia para relocalización, beneficios y servicios para desplazados, así como información sobre los horarios tentativos para la adquisición y construcción de ROW pueden ser obtenidos de la oficina del Condado de Bexar en la dirección mencionada abajo. La Asistencia de Relocalización está disponible para personas y negocios desplazados. Se espera que la construcción empiece en 2020.



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

gas from Texas shale fields into plastics and other petrochemicals. The study found that downstream facilities, such as petrochemical plants and refineries, may contribute nearly half the expected rise in emissions in Texas and Louisiana in the next decade.

Researchers analyzed planned and recently completed oil and gas production, pipeline, storage, refining, liquefied natural gas and petrochemical expansions for the analysis. Using data from emissions permits, facility capacities and emissions factors, they projected the expected green-

house gas emissions at each facility.

Petrochemical plants and refineries are likely to contribute the most to the expected rise in emissions in Texas and Louisiana, researchers found, representing about 46 percent of the projected increase, or 250 million tons of greenhouse gases. Of that, 206 million tons will be from petrochemical facilities, researchers estimate.

Production activities are expected to contribute 31 percent of the projected increase in regional oil and gas emissions, and pipelines and storage 22 percent.

An abundance of cheap natural gas has made feedstocks for petrochemical

and LNG processing plants inexpensive and helped to move power generation from coal.

Environmentalists, however, have criticized the recent increased reliance on natural gas, calling on the nation to move toward renewable sources instead.

Earlier this month, researchers at the Environmental Integrity Project completed a similar assessment, though limited to permitted facilities through 2025, and estimated that emissions from 157 planned oil and gas plants in the U.S. would result in 227 million additional tons of greenhouse gas emissions each year.

Airbags force big Nissan recall

DETROIT — Nissan is recalling nearly 346,000 vehicles worldwide to replace dangerous Takata air bag inflators that can explode and hurl shrapnel.

The Nissan front passenger inflators are among 10 million from 14 different automakers that Takata is recalling. It's the last recall that the bankrupt Takata agreed to in a 2015 settlement with U.S. safety regulators.

The Nissan recall covers

certain 2001 through 2003 Maximas, 2002 through 2006 Sentras, 2002 through 2004 Pathfinders, and 2007 through 2011 Versas. Also included are 2001 through 2004 Infiniti I30 and I35s, 2002 through 2003 QX4s, 2003 through 2008 FX35 and FX45s and 2006 through 2010 M35 and M45s.

Owners will be notified and dealers will replace the inflators starting around Feb. 10, at no cost to owners.

Most of the recalled vehicles are in North America,

but some are in Europe, the Middle East and Latin America, Nissan said.

The Nissan inflators are part of a recall that Takata announced earlier this month. They were sold to 14 different automakers, who will conduct their own recalls. Ford, Fiat Chrysler, Honda, Subaru, Ferrari and Mazda already have made recall announcements.

The recalled inflators were used to replace dangerous ones made by Takata until a permanent remedy could be developed.

In a federal lawsuit filed this week in San Antonio, Patch calls BBN a “predatory company” that “apparently believed it could take advantage of Buchanan’s and Aertker’s youth and relative inexperience in the business world in the hopes it could obtain a windfall off the backs of full-time college students.”

BNJ even filed a patent application claiming ownership of Patch’s technology, the lawsuit says.

The complaint, with various claims including misappropriation of trade secrets and breach of contract, seeks unspecified financial damages. Patch also seeks injunctions preventing BBN from manufacturing any products derived from Patch’s technology.

Calls to the four BBN owners or officers named in the suit weren’t immediately returned Wednesday. BBN has yet to file a response to the lawsuit.

Among the defendants is Douglas Conyers, a 1997 Trinity graduate whom Buchanan and Aertker say they placed particular trust in.

Conyers, listed in corporate records as BBN’s CEO, has served on the Trinity Alumni Association Board and was responsible for the school’s senior software project that ultimately would provide software to Patch, the suit says.

Patch says it’s been pushed into a “precarious financial situation” as a result of BBN’s actions. The dispute has made it difficult for Patch to raise money because investors are reluctant to invest, the suit says.

Patch had raised an undisclosed amount from investors and had a corporate

valuation of \$10 million, the suit adds.

Portions of the lawsuit were redacted to conceal “classified trade secrets,” said R. Laurence Macon, a San Antonio lawyer who represents Patch.

Buchanan, 20, is majoring in mathematical finance and economics and is slated to graduate this year. Aertker, 21, is majoring in computer science and philosophy, and expects to graduate in December.

The two were taking an entrepreneurship class when they started thinking about prescription drugs and people following dosage directions.

The pair spent months working on a smart pill-bottle cap, Aertker said. The cap dispenses medication one at a time, which helps those who have trouble opening the bottle caps.

The cap also lights up and a notification is sent to the consumer’s phone to alert them it’s time to take the medication.

“So it provides you a lot of different reminders and data to help you remember to take your medication and to know if you did

properly,” Aertker said. “This also helps the doctors and physicians, whether it’s in clinical trials or whether it’s in the retail pharmacy space — it helps everyone kind of know if people are being adherent to their medication.”

Patch had been working with BBN for about 18 months when Conyers let the students know BBN was working on a smart bottle cap of its own.

Aertker initially wasn’t alarmed by Conyers’ disclosure.

“Our initial reaction was, hey, this might help accelerate our ability to help people, and that’s really the goal,” Aertker said.

Jacob Kring, a Dallas attorney who also represents Patch, also said BBN officials made assurances they would not market Patch’s technology.

Kring said he believes BBN likely will argue it developed its own product independently from what Patch hired it to do.

“It’s unfathomable,” Kring said of that particular argument. “The idea that they could somehow take their chair and do a 360 and create something independent of what we were already paying them to do is just not believable.”

Patch filed a patent application in late 2018. It’s pending and has not been published yet, Aertker said.

BNJ indicated it also had filed a patent application last month, but Kring said they hadn’t been able to verify it.

Patch now is “trying to get its stuff” back — including computer code, software and electrical schematics — so it can start working with another engineering firm. But Kring said BBN is holding all of that property “hostage.”
