My venerable and esteemed Father, though I have written to your Reverence in a letter brought to you by Miguel de la Garza, I will ~~say~~ satisfy Your Reverence by a report which you ask of me; but it has been indispensable to anticipate this in a special way by the events and circumstances; to have a sure road and the means by which to pay the mail charges, it should be already in the hands of Your Reverence, but it is not possible that all of the allowance should go to extend to you many congratulations, etc. Priests of the Lord bless the Lord, because the Lord is good, because his mercy endures forever, as also so that Your Reverence and our holy College double the efforts to be apostolic; for we have as in hand an abundant harvest, which God our Lord without attending to my wickedness has deigned to give me.

The fact is that since I came to this Mission of Nacogdoches, the Orcoquisas Indians have not stopped asking me with importunity for a Mission, where I could be with them and the Spaniards, because they are very sad and discouraged in not being Christians and not knowing how to pray; they know they cannot be saved because their captain Calsones before he died told them many good things and commanded them not to leave ~~of~~ their land and never cease to ask for a mission as long as the Indians are here, etc.

Their words have always been rejected and distrusted because of the inconstancy of the Indians, since what moved them was self interest in having something to eat and wear without consideration that since they are thus the other nations are very annoying in asking a thousand times and much more in asking for food

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
