The Bexar County Sheriff's Office Training Academy is a fully licensed, fully accredited, law enforcement training academy. Licensed by the State of Texas, it is a full time facility located at 13500 Herring Rd., San Antonio, TX with a staff of 18 full time instructors. More than 20,000 officers from various agencies train with us every year. Classes are in session 6-7 days a week year round and include day and evening classes. Some days we may have more than 200 students in classes at the same time. From September 1, 2017 to present we have trained more than 46,000 officers.

Detention Training

The Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE) requires a Basic County Corrections Course of 120 hours. Our cadet training of 480 hours (12 weeks) is the longest County Corrections Academy in the state. In calendar years 2017-18, we trained 383 new Detention cadets.

Patrol Training

Our patrol officers attend three Academies before they hit the streets. The State requires a basic training of 728 hours. Our patrol officers receive three times that, 1928 hours before they graduate. That's more than any other police officer in the State of Texas. After the final Patrol Academy they're still not finished, they have 18 more weeks in the Patrol Training Officer (PTO) Program.

Continuing Education

Graduation from the Academy doesn't mean you're finished. Every year all officers regardless of rank must attend 40 hours of "In-Service" training. Here they receive legal updates, Crisis Intervention, Suicide Prevention, Firearms, etc. Additionally there is a special "In-Service" training for supervisors where they are trained on leadership topics as well as the other classes covered above.

Other classes

BCSO also offers "Stand alone" classes on a host of topics that include specialized training with State and nationally recognized speakers. Officers from other law enforcement agencies are welcome to attend most of our classes as well.

The BCSO Academy follows the TCOLE training cycle and begins September 1 every year. This year there are some changes to the BCSO Annual In-Service training.

All sworn officers are mandated by the Sheriff to attend the BCSO Academy In-Service training regardless of any other training hours.

- *All Detention Officers will attend a 24 hr. In-Service (Mon-Wed*).*
 - *All Law Enforcement Officers will attend a 40 hr. In-Service.*
 - *All supervisors Sgt. and above will attend a 40 hr. Supervisor's In-Service*

- Each week except for holiday weeks, Detention and Law Enforcement officers will attend classes the same days Monday – Wednesday. All Detention Officers regardless of dual PO license are finished with In-Service on Wednesday afternoon. LE Officers will continue and finish Friday.
 - There will also be a voluntary physical fitness evaluation. This is just a personal measure for those who wish to maintain fitness. The Cooper standards will be used. Those who do not wish to participate may remain in class until the end of the day.
 - Unless otherwise noted all classes meet from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm
 - ***** TCOLE has implemented a new rule governing County Corrections Officer carrying firearms as part of their regular duty assignment, i.e. Hospital duty. Any County Jailer who is NOT a Peace Officer must complete the County Corrections Firearms Course, TCOLE course #3599 AND obtain a Jailer Firearms Certificate (TCOLE Form # CRT 15.001 Jailer Firearms Certificate 7.2.2019). **County Jailers who are also Peace Officers are exempt from this requirement. If you are not sure contact the Academy.**

**** On weeks when a holiday falls on a Monday or Friday, classes are scheduled for Detention ONLY.***

TCOLE Licensing Training Mandates

The 2nd 24 month training unit began September 1, 2019 and ends August 31, 2021. It is imperative that all sworn staff complete their training mandates prior to the end of the 08/31/2021 cycle in order to maintain their license in compliance with BCSO policy and TCOLE rules and regulations.

All sworn staff **MUST** review their individual training records online on the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement website by visiting <http://www.tcole.texas.gov/content/training-requirements> and clicking the "Log In to MyTCOLE Account" button to access their individual training record.

The BCSO Academy offers the mandated courses and other courses as standalone and in-service training. Please visit our website at <http://www.bexar.org/600/Sheriffs-Office> to view our course listings or call us at 210-335-6229 for assistance. You are reminded to provide a PID number when emailing registration requests with supervisor approval. All registration requests should be submitted by supervisors to training@bexar.org. TCOLE Licensee Training Mandate Guide (09/01/2017 – 08/31/2021)

****Please Note - this is a “live” document and is subject to change at any time. Please be sure you are using the most recent version from the TCOLE website at www.tcole.texas.gov.**

This version is effective as of 09/01/2019.

Peace Officer (General):

Training Unit - each 2yr Unit (09/01/17 - 08/31/19, 09/01/19 - 08/31/21), Peace Officers must take:
The current Legislative Update (First Unit - 3185, Second Unit - 3186)(Rule 218.3(b))
40hrs, including the above 3185/6 course (Rule 218.3(b)).

Training Cycle - each 4yr Cycle (current 09/01/17 - 08/31/21), Peace Officers must take:

- If the Peace Officer has Intermediate Certification or higher - no Cycle requirements.
- If the Peace Officer does not achieve Intermediate Certification before the end of the Cycle - Cultural Diversity (3939), Crisis Intervention (3843), Special Investigative Topics (3232), De-escalation (1849) (Rule 218.3(c)).

Miscellaneous Training

- Peace Officers first licensed on or after 01/01/2011, must take Human Trafficking (3270)
- within 2 years of initial licensing (218.3(e)), if not taken in BPOC.
- Peace Officers first licensed on or after 01/01/2016, must take Canine Encounters (4065)
- within 2 years of initial licensing (Rule 218.3(e)), if not taken in BPOC.
- Peace Officers first licensed on or after 03/01/2016, must take Interacting with Deaf and Hard of Hearing Drivers (7887) within 2 years of licensing, if not taken in the BPOC.
- Peace Officers first licensed on or after 04/01/2018, must take the 40hr CIT (1850) within
- 2 years of licensing (Rule 218.3(e)), if not taken in BPOC.
- Peace Officers licensed before 01/01/2018, must take Civilian Interaction Training Program (CITP, 30418) by 01/01/2020. All other within 2 years of initial licensing, if not taken in BPOC, (Rule 218.3(e)).

Assignment Specific Training

- Peace Officers using Body Worn Cameras must take the Body Worn Camera course
- (8158) before using the cameras (Rule 218.3(d)), if not taken in BPOC.
- Peace Officers appointed to court security at ANY level of court, after 09/01/2017, must take the Court Security course (10999) within 1 year of assignment to that duty. Persons already appointed to courtroom security on 09/01/2017 are required to complete the course by 09/01/2019 (Rule 218.3(d) and SB42).
- Peace Officers performing the function of eyewitness identification, as designated by their agency, must first complete the Eyewitness Identification course (3286), beginning
- 01/01/2018 (Rule 218.3(d)).
- Peace Officers performing the function of School District Peace Officer or School Resource Officer must complete the School Based Law Enforcement Training (4064) within 180 days of assignment (Rule 218.3(d)) and a TCOLE approved SBLE Active Shooter Training (2195). Those who were appointed, prior to 09/01/2019, at school districts with a student population of 30,000 or less, have until 09/01/2020 to comply with both courses.
- Peace Officers appointed to their first position as a Police Supervisor must complete New
- Supervisor course (3737) within one year prior to or after the assignment (Rule 218.3(d)).
- Peace Officers at colleges/universities must complete a course on trauma informed investigation into sexual assault/harassment/dating violence/stalking (course numbers
- 3232, if completed after 08/20/19, 4070, and 470- TCOLE Online, are acceptable). No specific date is provided by statute.
- Peace Officers assigned to carry epinephrine auto-injectors (Epi-pens) must first complete Epinephrine Auto-Injector Training (1826).

Peace Officer (Specialized):

- Constables (note - this mandate overrides all Training Unit and Training Cycle mandates listed under Peace Officer above, but does NOT override Miscellaneous and Assignment Specific Training):
- Must take the New Constable Training (3742) within 2 years of being appointed (Rule 218.3(d)).
- Must take the Constable's Continuing Education (3743) each Cycle, thereafter (Rule 218.3(d)).
- Must complete Civil Process (1415) at a TCOLE designated college/university each Cycle. Deputy Constables:
- In addition to all of the Peace Officer (General) requirements, above, must take Civil Process (3131) each Cycle (Rule 218.3(d)).
- Police Chiefs (note - this mandate overrides all Training Unit and Training Cycle mandates listed under Peace Officer above, but does NOT override Miscellaneous and Assignment Specific Training):
- Must take New Chief's Training (3780) within 2 years of appointment (Rule 218.3(d)).
- Must take Chief's Continuing Education (3740) each Unit, thereafter (Rule 218.3(d)).

Jailer/Reserve Peace Officer Licensees/Public Security Officers:

- Training Unit - No requirements
- Training Cycle - must take Cultural Diversity (3939), unless exempted by Certification level in another license (Rule 218.3(c)).

Miscellaneous

- All Temporary Jailers must be enrolled in a Basic Correction Officer Course within 90 days of appointment.
- All current Jailers must take the Mental Health course (4900) by 08/31/2021, if not taken in BCOC (Rule 218.3(e)).
- All NEW Jail Administrators must pass the TCJS/TCOLE Jail Administrator course on the TCOLE website within 180 days of assignment as administrator, beginning 03/01/2018 (Gov't Code 511.00905).
- Jailers carrying a firearm as part as their assigned duty must first complete the Jail Firearms course (3599) AND obtain the Commission Jailer Firearm Certification. **NOTE: Jailers who are also Peace Officers are exempt from this requirement**

Telecommunicators:

- Training Unit - 20hrs (Rule 218.3(c)) Training Cycle - No requirements
- **Crisis Intervention Training Equivalents for Training Cycle Mandate only (not applicable for Proficiency Certification)-** CIT Train the Trainer (3840), CIT Update (3843), Mental Health Officer (4001), Basic Peace Officer Course, (1000643, or 1000667)).

*Some other courses may also have equivalents which will satisfy the listed course requirement. See the TCOLE website for more info.

Legislative Mandates begin the first FULL Cycle or Unit, AFTER initial licensing (Rule 218.3(i)), unless otherwise noted. * Unappointed licensees may NOT report their own training. They should insure that courses are only taken through a Contract Training Provider who will report the training for them.

**** Effective 08/26/2019, SB1397 (OC 1701.356) exempted the following- DPS Special Rangers, DPS Special Texas Rangers, TPW Special Game Wardens, and TABC Special Investigators, from all Training Unit, Training Cycle, and Miscellaneous Training Listed under Peace Officer (General), including 30418

Civilian Interaction Training Program (CITP). Assignment Specific mandates still apply.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES:

BCSO officers should register for training through the Academy by emailing their supervisor for approval for "on-duty" training. You may also register by sending a request via e-mail to training@bexar.org, calling 210-335-6955 or 6257, or in person from 0800-1600 hours at the Academy. Requests are processed in the order they are received.

For ALL registrations, please provide the following information:

- Name
- TCOLE PID Number or the last four digits of your Social Security Number
- Officers may be requested to provide supervisor leave approval prior to registering for a course

Any Peace Officer or Detention Officer from an outside agency wishing to attend "in-house" classes at the BCSO Academy must follow the below registration guidelines:

- They must be a licensed Peace Officer or Detention Officer currently employed by a law enforcement agency
- Outside Agency Officers must submit a written request to attend training (2) two weeks prior to the course date and email an authorization letter that includes the signed approval of his/her Department Sheriff, Chief, or Agency Training Officer to training@bexar.org.
- Outside agency registrations will accepted based on classroom space and resource availability. Inquiries can be made to training@bexar.org or by calling 210.335.6229.

Requests must be approved by the Training Academy prior to being scheduled to attend any class at the BCSO Academy. Outside agency officers are those not employed by Bexar County. "In-house" classes are those offered and taught locally by BCSO instructors.

The approved fee schedule for classes is:

Fees must be paid in full at the Bexar County Sheriff's Academy, 13500 Herring Rd. Atascosa, TX 78002, **prior to attending any classes**. Bank checks, money orders, or agency checks made out to Bexar County Sheriff's Office are accepted. **Cash and personal checks are not accepted**. The BCSO Academy will not endorse or approve any certificates to outside agencies without prior approval BEFORE attending class.

- *All supervisors Sgt. and above will attend a 40 hr. Supervisor's In-Service*

Detention Officers should have their supervisor email the Academy registrar at training@bexar.org to attend the 24 hour In-service. Supervisors and Deputies will receive a confirmation email from the training registrar.

IMPORTANT: Registered students and supervisors are responsible to notify the Academy of cancellations to fill the empty seat left behind. Please call the Academy report cancellations as early as possible: 210-335-6955 or 6257.

- BCSO supervisors should call the academy at 210-335-6229 to report any cancellations as soon as possible. Seating for training is limited and “no shows” for in-service training limit the opportunity to reschedule individuals on a waiting list. All BCSO officers must be authorized to register and attend in-service with supervisor approval for all training.
- Anyone assigned to light duty can attend in-service in a classroom setting ONLY – They cannot attend firearms or Taser training.
- Detention Officers who graduate after September 2019 should not attend this year’s in-service training, but should attend the following September 2020 in-service sessions.



Firearms training is held at the Bexar County Firing Range located at [3805 Farm Road](#). Please call ahead so that ammunition can be pulled and exact dates and times can be relayed to Deputies/Detention Officers.

Directions to the Range: Take 410 SE, Exit Southton Road. Keep right on Southton Road, turn left onto Farm Road, pass Cyndi Krier Juvenile Center and turn left on the first road past the Bexar County Sheriff Patrol/Academy complex. Follow the long road to the firing range.



BCSO RETIREE INFORMATION

Instructions for Retired Peace Officers requesting to demonstrate weapons proficiency:

Under provisions of the Texas Occupations Code, Title 10, Section 1701.357, retired Texas Peace Officers may apply for an opportunity to demonstrate weapons proficiency in order to carry a handgun. On successfully demonstrating their proficiency they may be issued a certificate of proficiency card, attesting to their proficiency.

This card must be accompanied by the bearer's Retired Peace Officers identification card in order to legally carry concealed as a retired peace officer (Texas Penal Code 46.15(a)(5), and 18 USC 926c).

Retirees desiring to qualify for a certificate of proficiency under Occupations Code 1701.357 shall contact the Sheriff's Academy firearms training unit (FTU) to schedule a range date appointment. The new retiree will need to report to Personnel to fill out an application (BCSO Form #350-443) for your retired credentials.

1. Fees: As approved by the Bexar County Commissioner's Court, a fee of \$35.00 shall be paid by anyone applying for a certificate of proficiency. **Applicants may submit payment in form of a money order or Cashier's check made payable to Bexar County Sheriff's Office. Personal checks or cash WILL NOT be accepted.**
2. Affidavit: On arriving at the Sheriff's Academy at the date and time of their appointment the retiree shall report to the Firearms Training Unit (FTU) staff, either at the Academy or at the firing range, as directed by the FTU.
 - a. The retiree must complete a sworn affidavit affirming that:
 - i. The officer honorably retired after not less than a total of 15 years of service as a commissioned officer with one or more state or local law enforcement agencies;
 - ii. The officer's license as a commissioned officer was not revoked or suspended for any period during the officer's term of service as a commissioned officer; and
 - iii. The officer has no psychological or physical disability that would interfere with the officer's proper handling of a handgun.
 - iv. He /She have never been convicted of a family violence offense and are not now charged with a family violence offense.
 - b. Once signed, the retiree will be sworn to the truthfulness of the affidavit by a licensed peace officer on the FTU staff and the affidavit and a copy of their paid receipt will be scanned and filed with the retiree's weapons qualification records.

3. Qualification: Retiree's shall provide their sidearm for inspection by the Firearms Proficiency Control Officer (FPCO) for his/her safety inspection and approval (Texas Admin Code 218.9). If the sidearm is semi-automatic they must have at least 2 magazines for that weapon. Only a holster made for that weapon will be accepted. **MUST BE OUTSIDE WAISTBAND HOLSTER. NO EXCEPTIONS.**
4. Retiree's shall provide no less than 150 rounds of ammunition for their sidearm. 100 rounds of ammunition will be used for the live fire training drills. The live fire training drills are mandated for all the retirees to accomplish prior to the firearms qualification course. 50 rounds of ammunition will then be used to successfully complete the BCSO qualification course. Shooters shall complete the current pistol qualification course of fire required of all deputies' in the BCSO.
5. All shooters will be given 2 opportunities to pass the qualification course. Failure will be recorded if the shooter fails to pass the qualification course after two consecutive tries. AN ADDITIONAL 50 ROUNDS AMMUNITION MUST BE PROVIDED BY THE SHOOTER FOR THEIR SECOND ATTEMPT TO QUALIFY IF NEEDED.
 - a. Additional attempts will only be granted with the authorization of the Training Coordinator, or designee.
 - b. Failure on any subsequent retries could result in permanent exclusion from the program
6. Upon successful completion of the qualification process, the retiree will be issued a Certificate of Proficiency card by the Bexar County Sheriff's Office Training Academy. **NO BCSO DUTY AMMUNITION WILL BE ISSUED.**
7. Any time a retiree carries a handgun under these provisions; he /she will carry both the Certificate of Proficiency card and their retired peace officer identification card, and shall present the cards upon request.
8. Any Certificate of Proficiency Card issued under these provisions will expire on the *first* anniversary of the date the Certificate of Proficiency was issued, within the State of Texas (OC 1701.357(d)). Retired officers to whom this section applies may request an annual evaluation and re- issuance of their certificate of proficiency as needed to comply with applicable Federal (18 USC 926c) or other laws requiring annual requalification.
9. Suspension or Revocation. A retiree's Certificate of Proficiency Card may be suspended or revoked for cause by the Sheriff or Sheriff's designee. Suspension will be directed any time the retired officer is arrested for a Class B misdemeanor or higher offense and the suspension shall remain in effect until resolution of the case. Revocation will be directed any time the retired officer is convicted of a Class B or higher offense. A certified letter will be sent to any retiree whose privileges under these provisions are revoked.

10. The letter will inform the retiree that the Certificate of Proficiency Card:

- a. Renewal or Replacement.
- b. Has been suspended or revoked;
- c. The retiree is no longer authorized to carry a handgun under the provisions of these sections of law; and
- d. The Weapons Proficiency Certificate/ Card are to be immediately surrendered to the Sheriff's Office.

11. Renewal or Replacement: To renew the Firearms Certificate of Proficiency Card the retiree must contact the Sheriff's Academy FTU, ***at least 4 weeks before the card is due to expire to obtain an appointment for a range date.*** The retiree shall follow the same procedures outlined in paragraphs 2 through 4 above, to obtain a replacement for the expired card.

If a Certificate of Proficiency card is lost while still valid, the retiree shall follow the same procedures identified for replacing an expired card. At the retiree's discretion, the replacement card may be issued showing the original expiration date and no re-qualification firing will be required, or the retiree may re-qualify on the range and a new expiration date will be established. **The fee of \$35.00 will still be required, in either case.**

Practice and Qualification: Those desiring some practice shooting can do so on Additional Proficiency Training (APT) days under Firearms Training schedule for dates and times.

You must bring your own ammunition (specific details will be provided with registration confirmation by e-mail). Retiree firearms qualification is held on Tuesdays from 1:00 pm to 5:00 p.m. at the County Firing Range. To schedule a qualification course, call 210-335-6229 or email training@bexar.org.
